



TUITION AND FEES

How to Apply?

Standard required courses prior to entry:

- Mathematics (Linear Algebra)
- Microeconomics
- Statistics (Probability Theory)
- University English (x2)

80% minimum "Grade Point Average" on most recent year of coursework. Minimum 65% in the required courses listed in agreement.

English language proficiency requirement:

- IELTS: 6.5 with no section less than 6.0 <u>OR</u>
- TOEFL: 90 (iBT) with no band less than 20

Students with IELTS 6.0 (each section 5.5) or TOEFL 79 (each section 17) may be offered conditional acceptance. A 4 week "University Admissions Preparation" course must be completed at UVic in August.


